Jack Rooney chosen as artist-in-residence for Studio 13 Residency pilot

- The Studio 13 Residency is an exciting new opportunity for London-based artists from minority backgrounds who consider social engagement as integral to their studio practice.
- The residency is intertwined with ACAVA's children, young people and family programmes in North Kensington, Flourish and Young Artists.
- Artist studio and pioneering community arts provider ACAVA
 has chosen Jack Rooney as the first artist to participate in the
 Studio 13 Residency, a self-funded pilot programme.

The Studio 13 Residency is a career development opportunity aimed at artists from minority backgrounds whose studio practice is based in social engagement. The programme has stemmed from ACAVA's desire to improve the continuing professional development they offer their artists and the ethnic diversity of their studio holders. In lieu of an artist fee, the residency offers a range of opportunities with a cash value of at least £3,500. Residents will receive a rent-free studio for six-months at our Blechynden Street Studios in North Kensington, London. CPD training will be offered depending on the artist's individual needs. This might include peer-to-peer support from other ACAVA artist facilitators, advice sessions on fundraising and social media with ACAVA staff members. Photographers from ACAVA Shoots - a paid placement programme for alumni of the Young and Emerging Photographers programme - are also available to document significant

events during the residency and the final images will be presented to the artist-in-residence at the end.

The Studio 13 Residency is intertwined with ACAVA's children, young people and family programmes in North Kensington, **Flourish** and **Young Artists**. As well as having the opportunity to further their studio practice, the artist will gain facilitation experience by delivering co-created workshops to a small group of 6-8 young people as part of the Young Artists programme. There will also be chances to get involved in Flourish workshops – ACAVA's intergenerational school holiday family programme for the local North Kensington community.

ACAVA's Programme team have chosen Jack Rooney as the first artist-in-residence. Jack Rooney lives in South London and of Guyanese and Irish heritage. Jack's practice stretches across many different mediums, but they are usually linked through his interest in socially and community-engaged performance-based works, with a highlight on the connections that we form with people, spaces, cultures, and with ourselves. Jack is driven to create and research more into the experience of the transnational subject, the idea of the social and cultural dislocation/s and the longing to reconnect – much of which could be explored within a current project 'The Moon where you are'.

ACAVA has a 20-year history collaborating with local communities in North Kensington, creating meaningful experiences with positive outcomes on wellbeing, personal growth, and social cohesion. Inspiring people to participate in the arts, promote confidence and learn new skills, it was recently shortlisted for the Award for Civic Arts Organisations (2022) by the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation and King's College London for this work.

Jack Rooney, Studio 13 Resident (2022) said:

"To be offered the space for 6-months would allow me to creatively exercise in ways that would otherwise be outside of my financial means. I felt that learning from the environment offered by ACAVA would allow me to develop my abilities and interests in socially engaged artistic processes from a space that has nearly 50 years of experience within this. With this is mind, I feel that my creative potential would feel seen, understood, and encouraged."

"I've been really enjoying getting back to making more physical works again – having the space to do that has been amazing, and it's something that I

haven't had ever before. I'm also excited with the thought of meeting and hopefully working with more people in the local area too."
