ACAVA's young and emerging photographers' group ACAVA Shoots - Jason Garcia, Ashleigh Ramel and Andreia Sofia with mentor Zute Lightfoot - have documented the project from the first workshops to the final installation.

Their photographs of the project and the local community will be on display at ACAVA's Maxilla Walk Studios and The Photographers' Gallery in June and July 2022.

ABOUT the PROJECT

- Walking as One is the culmination of a four-year project bringing together hundreds of local people to memorialise the tragedy through the creation of large-scale public mosaics.
- Marking the route of the Silent Walk, it features 39 mosaics. Each one contains 72 gold flecks representing each life lost, and 35 feature the word 'justice' reflecting the languages spoken in Grenfell Tower.
 - "We walked the Silent Walk from the beginning, to mark it in this way is a privilege."

ABOUT GRENFELL SILENT WALK

Conceived by local resident Zeyad Cred as a safe and peaceful form of protest for the local community, the Silent Walk offers a way for bereaved family members, survivors, residents and the wider community to demonstrate their solidarity and commitment to seek justice.

The walk features a 72 second silence to remember each life lost and a collective chant for justice.

"In the midst of the chaos it was one of the most beautiful things I have ever seen...the 30 minute walk of pure silence was the first time in weeks I felt like I could think."
